The EM SLOE asks the writer (or committee of writers) to describe the spread of grades assigned in their rotation, the applicant's position relative to peers on attributes deemed relevant to EM practice, and to estimate where the applicant would be ranked. #MedEdChat

Recognizing that it's not exactly objective in the psychometric sense, it at least prompts the writer to make a judgment (rather than simply glowing praise). As an interviewer, it's far more helpful. #MedEdChat
