1. What is the purpose of the Louis N. Pangaro Medical Educator Award?

The Alliance for Clinical Education (ACE) has as its mission inter-clerkship collaboration to enhance medical student education. Although our member organizations offer awards, ACE wants to recognize individuals who foster inter-clerkship/interdisciplinary collaboration beyond one's own specialty department.

2. How do I nominate someone for the Louis N. Pangaro Medical Educator Award?

Peers, mentors and others may nominate someone. ACE invites self-nominations. If a self-nomination is done, all aspects of the application are still expected—and there must be at least two other letters in addition to the self-nomination letter. There is a nomination form available to download on our website under "Application Process".

3. Who is eligible to be nominated?

- Nominees must be faculty appointed at the Associate Professor or Professor level.
- Nominees need to provide evidence of sustained involvement over a career in medical student education that is beyond one discipline.
- Nominees should be a member (or former member) of their respective clerkship organization, and/or show involvement in other national medical student education organizations, such as the Undergraduate Medical Education section of the Group on Educational Affairs.
- Members of the ACE Awards Committee are not eligible to be nominated for this award.

4. Who can write a supporting letter?

- A minimum of two and no more than four letters of support must accompany the nomination.
- One letter should be from a colleague or mentor from a different discipline of medicine than the nominee (For example, a nominee from psychiatry cannot have all letters from psychiatry).
- The other letters may be written by peers, mentors, current or former trainees.

5. When and where is the award presented?

The award will be presented at the annual Association of American Medical Colleges Learn Serve Lead conference at a reception hosted by ACE. The award recipient will be notified in early July of the date of the reception in order to register early for the meeting.

6. What if I cannot attend the meeting?

We will make arrangements for the award ceremony to be done virtually.

7. What do award recipients receive?

The award recipient will receive a plaque.

8. What happens if a person is not selected?

A nomination is usually considered for a total of three years. The nominator is encouraged to arrange at least one new letter of support in subsequent years and an updated CV.

9. Who is responsible for the awards process?

ACE has an awards committee comprised of representatives from each of its eight member organizations as well as members of the ACE Executive Committee.
